

Choose Chandra

Four competent attorneys want the chance to serve as Ohio's top lawyer for the next four years. However, in the May 2 primary election, **voters should advance Democrat Subodh Chandra** and Republican Betty Montgomery.

Chandra's surname isn't politically potent, but his credentials are excellent. During his tenure as Cleveland law director, the 38 year old former federal prosecutor rebuilt the city's law department ending what he called "the culture of cronyism and corruption."

Chandra, of Cleveland, is a hard working, dedicated public servant who would be a strong advocate for the people.
